Come, with all Thine angels, come, Raise the glorious harvest home.



Isaiah 36:13-17; 37:5-7 NLT

^{36:13} Then the chief of staff stood and shouted in Hebrew to the people on the wall, "Listen to this message from the great king of Assyria! ¹⁴ This is what the king says: Don't let Hezekiah deceive you. He will never be able to rescue you. ¹⁵ Don't let him fool you into trusting in the LORD by saying, 'The LORD will surely rescue us. This city will never fall into the hands of the Assyrian king!'

¹⁶ "Don't listen to Hezekiah! These are the terms the king of Assyria is offering: Make peace with me—open the gates and come out. Then each of you can continue eating from your own grapevine and fig tree and drinking from your own well. ¹⁷ Then I will arrange to take you to another land like this one—a land of grain and new wine, bread and vineyards.

^{37:5} After King Hezekiah's officials delivered the king's message to Isaiah, ⁶ the prophet replied, "Say to your master, 'This is what the LORD says: Do not be

disturbed by this blasphemous speech against me from the Assyrian king's messengers. ⁷ Listen! I myself will move against him, and the king will receive a message that he is needed at home. So he will return to his land, where I will have him killed with a sword."
